Have you reached pension age and need care for a disability or illness? You could qualify for **Attendance Allowance**

If you've reached state pension age and need care for an illness or disability, you may be entitled to financial help.

This money is called an Attendance Allowance. How much you get depends on how much help you need.

You can still get it if you're working, because your income isn't taken into account.

If you receive Attendance Allowance this might open the door to other things like Pension Credit, Housing Benefit and a Council tax reduction.

Reading this could add to your **Income**



Are you caring for someone for 35 hours a week or more? You could be entitled to a **Carer's Allowance**

Around £4.5 million of Carer's Allowance goes unclaimed in the Canterbury district each year - even though people are entitled to it.

This money could be yours - and it only takes a few minutes to find out.

If you're 16 or over, take home less than £151 a week and provide substantial care for someone for 35 hours or more, you could qualify.

Life's tough if you're giving up your time to look after a relative's personal care and

household tasks. However, your claim could affect the benefits of the person you are caring for, so its important to check with DWP before applying.
